They may seem convincing at first, but under closer examination, their underlying assumptions don't hold up. Fallacious arguments may oversimplify, fail to provide adequate evidence, make jumps in logic, or divert attention from the real issues. Also, identifying the flaws in what someone is saying or writing is necessary for a critical analysis. There are several logical fallacies: sweeping generalization - hasty generalization resulting in conclusion that is not necessarily accurate; inductive reasoning (going from a particular point to a universal rule) which is not thought through carefully.
