In 1892 Homer Plessy, a mulatto who was 7/8 white, was arrested for riding on a Louisiana train in the section reserved for “whites only”. Plessy v. Ferguson was the first major inquiry into the meaning of the Fourteenth Amendment’s (1868) equal-protection clause, which prohibits the states from denying “equal protection of the laws” to any person within their jurisdictions.
